#### **Club History**

HARTLEY Wintney Football Club was founded in 1897, the club's nickname 'The Row' coming from Hartley Row, a former hamlet of Hartley Wintney.

In the 1940s and 50s, the club played at Causeway Farm adjacent to the cricket club, in the Basingstoke League. The minutes of meetings covering 15 seasons from 1948, compiled by the club's outstanding secretary Fred Cook, includes the change of club colours from blue squares to tangerine in 1956.

The club moved to the Memorial Ground on Green Lane in 1953 and later joined the Aldershot League. In 1973, Glynn Howells was appointed as manager. In his six-year reign, the team won the Aldershot Senior League three times in succession, and the Aldershot Senior Cup.

A founder member of the Combined Counties League in 1978, Hartley later appointed Ian Bedford as manager. An influx of senior players during the 80s included several ex-pros: Mick Travers (ex-Reading, Portsmouth and Aldershot); Richard Walden (ex-Aldershot, Sheffield Wednesday and Newport County) and Steve Finnieston (ex-Chelsea, Cardiff City and Sheffield United).

Under Bedford's management, the club won the Aldershot Senior Cup (1980/81), the George Allen Cup (1981/82) and the Combined Counties League (1982/83). A new clubhouse was opened with David Willoughby, secretary and treasurer, and Bill Mitchell, club chairman, devoting exceptional hours to this venture.

The club gained promotion to the Combined Counties Premier under the management of Mike Scott in 2007/08, but the following season ended in relegation. The team rallied following the appointments of Pete Gray and John Condon in 2009/10 and Louis King in 2010/11.



Ex-Millwall defender Dave Tuttle was given the summer to prepare a squad for 2012/13. However, a string of poor results led to a second change in management within four months and 24-year-old ex-Hartley striker Ben Dillon was given his first managerial role.

Alongside Jason Minton and Joe Lawler, Dillon set about rebuilding, with Hartley well adrift at the bottom of the table. The introduction of a talented group of players restored the spirit around the club and, in what became known as the club's 'Great Escape', the Row's place in the CCL Premier was secured against all the odds.

Finishing 7th in CCL Premier in 2013/14, the footballing highlight was the run to the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup for the first ever time, losing to Daventry Town in front of a home crowd of over 1,000.

The new club crest was commissioned during the season; designer Philippa Bell incorporated elements from the 13th century when the village of Hertleye Wynteneye drew its name from 'the clearing in the forest where the deer graze by Winta's island', hence the tree and stag motifs.

The 2014/15 season saw the club finish 9th in the CCL Premier, after which Dillon stepped down; Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick were appointed as joint managers, with Luke Tuffs as first team coach.

2015/16 was very eventful. After a memorable FA Cup win at Merthyr Town, Hartley came back from two down, only to concede an injury time goal at Conference South side Eastbourne Borough. In the FA Vase, a longstanding club record was broken by reaching the 5th Round Proper. In front of a sellout 1,300 at Green Lane, eventual finalists Hereford proved too strong, but the Row went on to claim the CCL Premier Division title; however, promotion was denied due to ground grading.

The 2016/17 season under Brownlie and Millerick was extraordinary. Propelled by the goals of strike duo Sam Argent and Ross Cook, the Row topped the CCL Premier Division for the entire season, reached the semi-final of the Hampshire Senior Cup and the final of the Aldershot Senior Cup. Guided by chairman Luke Mullen, the club secured the required ground grading to take their place in the Southern League at Step 4 for the first time 2017/18 was as successful as the previous season. The club embarked on their first FA Trophy campaign, going out in the 1st Round Proper to eventual finalists Bromley. In Southern League South (East Division), the Row sat within the top four for much of the season. A play-off place was secured, with the Row winning their semi-final against AFC Dunstable. In front of a crowd of over 700 at Green Lane, a tense game against Cambridge City was decided by a Nic Ciardini goal – who was on the end of Jack Ball's towering header - to gain promotion to Southern Premier South at Step 3. The season's closing highlight was lifting the Aldershot Senior Cup.

With Dan Turkington now alongside Millerick in the dugout, 2018/19 started well at Step 3, with a late run seeing Hartley finish 8th. To remain at that level required another round of ground improvements, stretching the club and its volunteers to the limit.

The 2019/20 campaign clicked into gear for the Row shortly before the season was abandoned due to the Covid pandemic. The return of familiar faces to the squad in the New Year had promised an exciting run-in. Instead, it became a battle off the pitch for the club's financial survival.

This battle was to continue when 2020/21 was again cut short, though not before Hartley reached the 4th Qualifying Round of the FA Cup, going out at National League side Dagenham & Redbridge by a solitary goal. In the Hampshire Senior Invitational Cup, a competition staged as Covid restrictions were eased, Hartley lifted the trophy in the final against Folland Sports.

There was deep sadness in 2021 when club president Bill Mitchell passed away in April. He had been a huge influence on the club and a true gentleman who continued his family's tradition of being Hartley Wintney through and through.



2021/22 proved tough, with the club's resources severely depleted. The huge task of surviving at Step 3 was achieved with another good run-in, while silverware arrived by way of the Aldershot Senior Cup, with the Row beating Fleet Town in the final. After his hugely successful spell as manager, 'Millers' stepped down at the end of the season, becoming the club's Director of Football.

Development team manager Ross Weatherstone and first team coach Ty Newton were appointed as joint managers for 2022/23. Pre-season results were encouraging, but the team struggled in the league and the pair resigned in October. Ex-Arsenal pro Ian Selley and his assistant, Mick Bennett, took charge but, after a reasonable start, results again failed to meet expectations.

With the club in the relegation zone, the Row turned to two former players, expro Rowan Vine, and Shane Hollamby. The pair steadied the ship, returned belief to the fans and the playing group, and worked the team back to being competitive in every game. But the lack of financial headroom finally hit home. Without the cutting edge of a proven goalscorer to turn the draws and narrow losses into wins, the Row were relegated.

After so much recent success, 2023/24 saw Hartley Wintney FC in transition and looking to rebuild as it took its place in the Isthmian League South Central division under manager Danny Ackland. Hartley finished it's first Isthmian season mid table in 10<sup>th</sup> position.

Season 2024/25 sees another change of management and almost a new squad. Joint managers Jamie Daltry and John Cooke are looking to steer The Row to success after their own successful season at Knaphill where they took the Knappers to the CCL playoff semi final.

#### 29.7.25. Hamworthy Rec 2 Millbrook 0

A good start to the new season for Rec with this win, but it was a really tough test for them. Make no mistake, Millbrook look a very competitive side and on this showing will be pushing for a play-off place. They dominated possession for long periods and will be gutted to have got nothing from the game. Having said that, Rec defended gallantly, with keeper, Felix Bruce and the back four all heroes.

The hosts took advantage of a bright start and were two up within 20 minutes courtesy of a Max Wilcock double. After that Millbrook got into the game and bossed the second half, denying Rec time and space on the ball. But Rec read the game well and were happy to defend their lead- at times it wasn't pretty, but effective.

Ash Pope had a chance in the first minute, for Rec, but his low shot was saved by Szymaniak - the Millbrook keeper injuring himself in the process. But on 9m Rec opened their account for the season with a fine goal. A neat move culminated with Chris Long playing in WILCOCK to drill a low shot to the keepers right, for 1-0.

Millbrook's first venture forward of note saw Hills' attempt from inside the area blocked - the first of many.

Rec stunned the visitors again on 19m, when Long was again the provider, with a perfect cross for WILCOCK to power a header past Szymaniak and it was nearly three when Long's shot from a tight angle flashed across the face of goal.

The visitors then had a spell of pressure and Hilton-Jones was unlucky with a great free-kick that thumped against the bar, before Parker had his free-kick well saved by Bruce. HT 2-0.

Millbrook were forced into a change at the start of the second half when keeper, Szymaniak fell victim to his earlier knock and was forced off, replaced by goalkeeper coach, Mike Weatherall. Bruce, in the home goal fell victim to the new "8 second" rule, gifting the visitors a corner, from which Rec scrambled a goalbound effort off the line and it was pressure all the way from Millbrook, but with the Rec defence up to the task. In fact, they nearly increased their lead when Wilcock, in search of a treble, fired just wide and Ben Satterley's free-kick was well tipped over by Weatherall.

But it was the visitors who kept pressing, with Hills shooting over the bar and Parker's free-kick saved by Bruce, before Regan Mason did well to head another goalbound effort off the line, as Rec held out for a hard - earned three points.

Nick Medcraft joins us from Fleet Town, where he won Players Player of the Year in 2024/25. An energetic full back who offers so much more than just defensive capabilities. He will link up with some familiar faces having featured alongside some of our current crop whilst at Badshot Lea.

#### **KANYE MOYO – Forward**

Kanye has made the move from the Development Team to the First Team in the sum. He is an energetic and hard-working young forward with a keen eye for goal.

#### **KYEN NICHOLAS – Forward**

Our former marksman returned to The Row at the end of February 2025 after spells with Hanworth Villa & Raynes Park Vale in the Isthmian League South Central. He scored 6 goals in 16 appearances for Vale before his return to The Row. Kyen only managed 2 appearances for us before injury ended his participation in 2024/25.

#### JAKE RUMBLE - Defender

Jake is no stranger to Hartley fans having had 2 previous stints with the Club. After leaving in 2023 to explore Soccer in Australia, he returned to the UK towards the end of the 2024/25 season. A full back who possesses great technical ability, Jake returns to The Row ahead of 2025/26 season.

#### SAM TANNER – Forward

Sam signed for The Row at the start of March 2025 from Thatcham Town FC.

He scored 11 goals in 76 appearances in just under 2 seasons

#### GEORGE TURNER - Midfielder

George treads the Clubs proven pathway from our U18 Allied Counties Team to the Development Team and now into the First Team. A young wide man with pace and energy.

#### CALLUM WILTSHIRE - Defender

A defender who joins us from Badshot Lea. Despite his age he has already amassed over 75 games at step 4. A calm and composed defender with a tough tackling side to him.

#### Hamworthy Recreation FC - History

Hamworthy Recreation Football Club was formed in 1948 as Hamworthy Engineering FC and played on the Sports Ground opposite the factory at Fleetsbridge in Poole (where the Tesco supermarket now stands). When the site at Fleetsbridge was sold to Tesco in the late 1980's the football, along with the Sports & Social Club, moved to its current home at Magna Road.

At that time 'Hamworthy Engineering FC' were playing in the Bournemouth League (Division 1). The Club won the Bournemouth Senior Cup in the 1988-89 season, and after winning the Division One Championship in 1990/91 'The Rec' successfully applied to join the Dorset Combination League for season 92/93 when they finished 3rd. Success soon followed when the Club won a hatrick of Combination League Championships in 1993-94, 1994-95 and 1995-96.

'The Rec' have lifted the League Championship Trophy on another nine occasions, 2000/01, 2001/02, 2004/05, 2009/10, 2010/11, 2014/15, 2017/18, 2018/19 and 2021/22. The Club have won the League Cup on six occasions - 2000/01,2006/07, 2007/08, 2013/14, 2014/15 and 2021/22.

'The Rec' consider that their greatest achievement was in 1995, when not only did they win the League Championship, but also won the Dorset Senior Cup, defeating Weymouth Football Club from the Southern League by 3 goals to nil at Magna Road in the Semi-Final, and Poole Town FC, another Southern League team, 4 - 1 in the Final. The 2001-01 season saw the Club change its name to Hamworthy Recreation FC to reflect the name of their current headquarters. Our proud boast — we've never finished below 6th since Ham Eng joined the Combination in 1992/93.

When the Club won promotion to the Wessex League the Reserves moved to The Hampshire Development League, winning Div 1 at the first attempt and finishing a commendable mid table in 20223/24 having been promoted to the Premier Div.. For the 2024/25 season they applied for, and were granted, a place in the Dorset Premier League, in which the Club has such a rich history.

During 2022 and 2024, with funding support from the Football Foundation and local sponsors' we managed to get the ground upgraded to have floodlights and a 100 Seat Stand and so have progressed to the Wessex Premier League. We have a Reservs Team, both as a feeder team from our Under 18's and upwards towards our First team.

We now have the following teams and Leagues:

- First Team in the Premier League of the Wessex League
- Reserves in the Dorset Premier League
- Under 18 Team who play in the Dorset Football League U18s Division 1
- And we welcome a new U17 Team in the Dorset Football League U17 Division 1


